The vision of the lowa State University Women's Club is to create unity through friendship, promote a sense of belonging with each other and within the community, and as we grow, to have an impact on our society.

lowa State University® Women's Club is a social and service organization providing opportunities for friendship, personal growth, and enrichment. Members have an opportunity to participate in various activities to expand their intellectual and social horizons. Membership is open to any woman who supports the vision and mission of the club:

The vision of the Iowa State University® Women's Club is to create unity through friendship, to promote a sense of belonging with each other and within the community; and as we grow, to have an impact on our society.

To this end, our **mission** is to

- 1. welcome and involve women of various interests, ages, and experiences;
- 2. provide opportunities for individual growth and enrichment;
- 3. support scholarship and community service; and
- 4. grow and develop as an organization.

Over the years the club has grown and adapted to the changing roles of women. Beginning as the Priscilla Club in November 1897, the club was founded by faculty wives who wanted to promote the social interaction of faculty as well as help integrate new faculty families into the community. Mrs. C.F. Curtiss and Mrs. G.L. McKay invited eleven other wives of faculty who lived on campus to spend Wednesday afternoons together in fellowship and study. The women came with their children and handiwork; one member read aloud while the others sewed and tended the children. The women with their workbags, striding along the snowy campus paths, reminded someone of a well-known painting of Priscilla Alden walking through the woods; therefore, the name, Priscilla Club, came quite naturally.

The Priscilla Club became Faculty Women's Club of Iowa State College in 1917 with a broadened scope and more formal organization. "College" became "University" in 1959 mirroring the institution's name change. In 1996, the club's name changed to Iowa State University® Women's Club and membership has broadened to include women who share the club's vision and mission. More of the club's first 100-year history can be found in *Keepsakes: A History of the Iowa State University Women's Club 1897-1997*, a 216-page book self-published as part of the 100th Anniversary celebration. Copies are still available or can be downloaded from our website, https://www.isuwc.org/.

The International and Senior Award Fund is the club's proudest achievement. As an endowment funded by members' giving through tax-deductible annual contributions, "in memory of" or "in honor of" gifts, or planned giving, the fund is used to recognize and honor outstanding Iowa State University women students with annual monetary awards.

The 2019-2020 club year began with an "opener" in September to welcome new and returning members. The Fall Trip continued with an adventure to Decorah, IA. The Holiday social was held at The Knoll, home of the Iowa State University President, Wendy Wintersteen. In March of 2020, the country was engulfed in concerns over COVID-19, the world-wide pandemic. The March 2020 program '100 Years of Suffrage' was cancelled due to the pandemic and rescheduled for October 2020. The club adapted to the challenges of limiting in-person activities and canceled the Spring Luncheon. Interest groups found ways to meet outdoors or virtually. In early May new, continuing, and retiring Cabinet members met jointly via Zoom and the presidential gavel was symbolically passed. Events and activities proposed for the 2020-2021 program year included contingency plans for virtual or other options if in-person gatherings were not feasible. Members were resilient and creative to fulfill our mission of promoting friendship, giving back to our community, and growing the International and Student Award Fund to provide more student scholarships. Onward ISUWC goes!

Donna J. Cleasby, 90, died on June 14, 2019, at Northcrest Health Center in Ames.

Donna was born Nov. 25, 1928, in Madison, Wis., the daughter of Clifford Haugh and Hyla (Timmons) Haugh. She graduated from Madison West High School in 1946. She attended the University of Wisconsin and Layton School of Art in Milwaukee. She met John L (Jack) Cleasby before moving to Milwaukee to study art and dress design in 1947. They continued their relationship while Donna continued her studies in Milwaukee. After Jack's graduation in civil engineering at UW, they were married on Sept. 2, 1950 in Madison. They continued living in Madison while Jack did graduate studies and Donna was the primary support with her

jobs, ending at Madison Gas & Electric Co. They moved to follow Jack's employment opportunities, first to Gary, Ind., and later to Chicago, where they lived in North Riverside, Ill., and she worked at International Harvester. In 1954, they moved to Ames, when Jack joined the ISU faculty.

Later, three children joined the family, Teresa in 1957, Richard in 1959 and Lynne in 1965. The family enjoyed many domestic travels, camping, water sports and winter sports together. Donna used her sewing skills from art school to craft many clothes for the children and herself. She and Jack loved to dance and exercised that love wherever the opportunity occurred.

Donna enjoyed classes at the Octagon, was an active member of First Baptist Church (Ames), involved in many church activities. After a year in England with her family (1975-76), she became active in Friends of Foreign Wives, including service as president for two years. She became very active assisting a Laotian family sponsored by her church assisting with English, transportation, and homemaking, becoming mom and grandma to the parents and four children of that family.

She also assisted YSS in its "Children at Risk" program and with other volunteer activities. She enjoyed cooking and hosted many national and international students in her home. She and Jack did extensive international traveling, visiting 34 countries on five continents, some multiple times. Donna was a 55-year member of the Iowa State University Women's Club.
