The Scholarship Committee wants to thank the membership for the support the scholarship fund received last year. We also want to thank the Block Builders for their support through the garage sale they held and to the entire membership for their support of the holiday social silent auction. Thank you to all members for your generosity!

For the current academic year, the scholarship committee was able to award seven (7) \$1,000 scholarships. Our amazing women student recipients are very interesting, gifted and extremely dedication to their fields of studies. This year their studies include:

- PhD, Molecular, Cellular, and Developmental Biology, Interdepartmental Program
- PhD, Major: Biochemistry; Graduate Study--Plant Pathology and Microbiology
- PhD, Civil Engineering (Structural Engineering & Intelligent Infrastructure Engineering)
- MS, Community Development; Sustainable Agriculture
- Senior, Political Science; Public Relations
- PhD, Applied Linguistics and Technology
- DVM, Doctor of Veterinary Medicine

The hometowns of our recipients include Naperville, IL, Ames, IA, Prescott, AZ, Eagle Grove, IA ,Denison, IA and two international students from Turkey.

Each year the Scholarship Committee members invite the scholarship recipients to a dinner so we can meet and get to know the women. It is always interesting to hear about what they are doing. One of our recipients is working on a virus that kills cancer cells. Another one is studying ways to improve our lowa roads. Yet another one dreams of serving as White House Press Secretary or President of the United States.

In addition to the \$7,000.00 mentioned above, Block Builders gave five (5) \$1,000 scholarships to students from Iowa majoring in Apparel, Merchandising, and Design from funds raised through sales of donated fabric.


